The National Day of Mourning is marked every April 28 to remember those who have lost their lives, or suffered injury or illness, due to a work-related incident. It is also a time to re-commit ourselves to safety and health in the workplace and the prevention of further injury, illness and death.

This special day began in Canada and now takes place in more than 100 countries around the world. Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, many related events have been cancelled or have moved online.

In Winnipeg, the annual SAFE Workers of Tomorrow Leaders' Walk, which normally takes place along Broadway, has been cancelled for this year. Steps for Life 2021

Every day in Canada, three workers lose their lives on the job, leaving more than 1,000 families to mourn their loved ones after a workplace tragedy each year.

Threads of Life is an association that supports the healing journey of families who have suffered from a workplace fatality, traumatic life-altering injury or occupational disease.

Each spring, the association holds a five-kilometre walk to raise funds that support affected families. Steps for Life 2021 - Winnipeg will



be different due to the COVID-19 pandemic. You can plan your own walk with your household members or participate in any manner that respects local public health guidelines. A virtual opening ceremony will take place on Sunday,



May 2. Details, including the time of the ceremony, will be announced at a later date.
