(listed below) Have coverage in place for all of their regular workers or ONLY have volunteers as workers (not employing any regular workers). Non Profit An organization organized and operating for a purpose other than making a profit and directs its resources to furthering its objectives May or may not be registered with the Canadian Revenue Agency ("CRA") and provide the appropriate CRA registration number. Is not entitled to issue tax receipts for donation or membership fees. Charitable Organization that is registered as a charity under the Income Tax Act and recognized by the Canadian Revenue Agency ("CRA"). 	 Coverage for emergency volunteer fire fighters is mandatory and is found under 802-02, "Emergency Firefighters". Coverage for emergency volunteer ambulance attendants is mandatory and is found under 802-03, "Emergency Ambulance Workers".
